


Create a new ICS Online account and register for visitation

If you have not already created an account with *ICS Online*, you must do so before scheduling an *In-Person* or *Video Visit*. Please refer to the following instructions for information on creating a new *ICS Online* account and registering for visitation.

1. Go to https://www.icsolutions.com/ from your internet browser. Click **Create Account** or enter the information in the *Create Account* section and click **Submit**.




2. You will be taken to the *Create New Account* page. Enter your desired username, 4-digit PIN, and password twice. Then click **Sign Up**.

3. Complete all the fields including your name, email address, phone number you wish to receive calls on, and the address that matches your credit/debit card or phone bill.



4. Check the box to register for visitation.



- This will automatically take you through visitation registration after creating your account.
 - 5. Click Sign Up.





6. Start typing the facility name and select the facility name from the dropdown list.



7. When registering, all the required fields must be completed. The visitor must define the inmate who they want to visit and must also define the relationship. Visitors will only be able to visit with an inmate who is on your approved inmate list.



- Steps 8 and 9 shown below apply only if you are registering for a privileged relationship.
- 8. If you register for a **privileged** relationship, your facility may require your relationship to be approved. Please check the applicable rules for the facility with whom you will be conducting visits.
- Any request for a privileged relationship will set to a pending status and you will be unable to schedule and conduct video visitation until the relationship has been approved by the facility's Video Administrator.
 - **9.** After a **privileged** relationship has been approved, you can schedule and conduct visitation sessions with inmates. The approval process ensures these visits will not be recorded.
